There is increasing interest in resident and housestaff unionization, with residents at prominent healthcare systems recently completing or beginning the process. The promise of resident unionization includes better working conditions for trainees as a result of collective bargaining. Others believe unions are ineffective or even detrimental to resident education. Surgical residents have unique educational needs relative to other specialties and may not be adequately informed regarding the potential educational benefits or risks of resident unionization. The purpose of this educational session is to share information regarding the unionization process and share examples of union activities so that surgical trainees can be better informed regarding their decision to participate in the unionization process or not.
